Milo "Mac" E. McNall, Jr. age 92, of Topeka passed away Saturday, December 1, 2007 at a Topeka hospital. He was born September 20, 1915 in Gaylord, KS the son of Milo E. McNall, Sr. and Laura A. He was a member of the Ottawa 69er's Coachmen Camping Club where he served as past president. He served as past state president of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles. He also served as past president of the Kaw Valley Amateur Radio Club where he was the "amateur of the year" in 1983. He was also a member of the Osage County Amateur Radio Club; past president and member of the Bulldozers Camping Club of Topeka. He was a 62 year member of the Orient Lodge #51 of A.F. & A.M. of Topeka. He taught amateur radio in Topeka and while in Texas. Recently he was a member, vice president and past president of the Stratojets Dance Club, the Wheathearts Square Dance Club and the Flipsides Dance Club. He was currently the Publicity Officer of the Kansas Square Dance Association. He was preceded in death by a son, Alben Bergstrom, a daughter Karen Bennett, a granddaughter Nicole McNall, a great granddaughter, Brandy Waltermann. He is survived by two sons, Larry G. McNall of Overland Park, KS and Lynn T. McNall of Bartlett, Tennessee; two daughters, Carol E.
